In 1900, notwithstanding the magnificent record of McKinley and Rossevelt, and the splendid personality of Yorkes, Kentucky was again carried by the democrats. In 1903 the federal republican efficeholders, hooted spurned, ran over Wilson and Pratt nominating Belknap for governor, and he was beaten by the enormous major ity of 26,000 and only a handful of numbers were elected to the general as sembly. In 1907 the federal office adders lost control and the old-line resubdicans nominated a ticket that we
