Twenty Agres Sell for \$16,500---Recore Price in Valley---\$200 an Agre Profit in Six Months for Seller

C. W. Potter and G. G. Goold of St. Johns, Or., have purchased the H. T. Hall orehard, a mile and a half south west of Medford, of 20 acres, paying \$16,500, or \$825 an nero, the highest price ever paid for young orchard land in the history of the Rogue River val-

The property consists of 20 acres of 2 year old Newtown pippins and Spitz-enberg apples and d Anjon and Howell It is the north half of the 40 DCATS. acre tract which was purchased by Hull & Parker from J. E. Watt last antumn for \$25,000, or \$12,500 and the transaction nets Mr. Hull just \$4000, or \$200 nn ners profit in less than six months. The same land was purchased by Mr. Wati two years ago last February for \$225 an acre, or \$10,000, and the year before that was sold for \$150. This is a profit of \$600 an aere in two years and \$675 an acre in three years. Eight years ago the land was pur based, unplanted, for \$40 an acre

The purchasers secure one of the fin st young orchards in the valley. The trees are mostly Newtown pippin, with a few Spitzenbergs, and are 9 years old. They produced their first crop-last year, which sold for \$3300. This year it will double in production, and

Even at the price of \$825 an agre the myers will do better, say old orehard ists, than to buy land at \$100 an acre Next year's crop will bring them interest on the money in vested and the profits will greatly in
