ORDINANCE NO. 145.

An ordinance to prevent and prohibit female persons from entering, going or being in any saloon, barroom, tipping house or drinking place or other room, house or place where spirituous malt, vinous or intoxicating liquors of any kind are sold within the corporate limits of the City of Medford, Oregon. The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. Hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation engaged, either as owner or owners, proprietor or proprietors, agent or agents, employee or employees in the running or carrying on of any saloon, barroom, tipping house or drinking place or other room, house or place where spirituous, malt, vinous or intoxicating liquors of any kind are sold or kept for sale within the corporate limits of the city of Medford, Oregon, to permit or allow any female person at any time to enter, go, come or be within his or their place of business, or any room, house or place adjoining or adjacent thereto, where such intoxicants are sold or kept as delivered after sale.

PORTLAND ACCOUNT OF FANSHER TRAGEDY

According to Eyewitness, Young Man Was Crossing Street and in Going Around Track Was Struck by Car—Was Probably Looking at Derrick.

The Portland Oregonian gives the following account of the death of S. Young, Mayor of Medford, Thursday night.

YOUNG FANSHER, 25 years of age, whose home was in Medford, Or., was the driver of a motor car which was struck by a street car at the corner of Second and Main streets. Section 2. Any person or persons, firm or corporation engaged in the selling of such intoxicants who shall violate any of the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance, or being convicted before the city recorder for such violation, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1000, and in failure to pay such fine may be imprisoned in the city jail at the rate of one day for each \$2 of such fine until the same is paid. Section 3. Any female person who shall violate any of the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance shall, upon conviction before the city recorder, be punished by a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than \$1000, and in failure to pay such fine may be imprisoned in the city jail at the rate of one day for each \$2 of such fine until the same is paid. Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. The foregoing ordinance No. 145, was passed by the city council of the City of Medford, Oregon, on the 17th day of March, 1908, by the following vote: Ayes, 10; Nays, 0. Attest: BENJ. M.
