RECORD HOUSE HEARS "THE BURGOMASTER"

Tuneful Opera Delights Many—Comedians Good and Fun Genuine—Chorus Girls Pretty and Graceful—Need of New Playhouse Emphasized.

"The Borgomaster" filled the opera house to its capacity, the record receipts of the season, which emphasized the fact that a new theater in Medford is a "consummation devoutly to be wished." Fashion was out in its finest feathers, and a goodly representation from the surrounding towns was there. The company was an excellent one, the play beautifully staged and prettily costumed.

As to the play itself, the excellence of the actors has made it a good one, and not the author of the book. While there are a few catchy numbers in the music and perhaps as a whole it might be considered popular, yet, compared with the compositions of Arthur Sullivan, Audran, Loeoq and Planquette, our present composers, like Hamlet's crab, have been crawling backward.

When "Pinafore" opened a field in America for comic opera there was but little known about stagecraft, and the drilling and training of choruses in bright and picturesque action. If someone would write an opera with the musical merit of "Chimes of Normandy," "Girofle" or "Pinafore," and give it to our modern stage manager to produce we would indeed see a performance worth while. They say the "Merry Widow" is up to this mark, and if we get a new opera house, Manager Haselrigg promises to open with this great production. Let us boost.

Is First-Class Comedian.

But I am digressing. We must talk a little of the actors. The central figure of the play is the burgomaster, who had a very able exponent in Gus Weinburg. Mr. Weinburg is a comedian that has passed the point of trying to be funny. He is funny, and has really made his part in the play; the author gave him the skeleton and he has clothed it in a humorous manner. In a word, he may be truthfully ranked among the few first-class comedians, and their number is not too many. True comedy is a serious business. Mr. Weinburg comprehends the gravity of the situation.

Leo Kendall as Double Van Kull was the funny running mate. He is a good comedian, who knows just how far to go and where the draw line. He is not of the over-ambitious kind that try to neutralize the work of others.

Miss Ruth White was the Willie Aschmitt of the play. She succeeds in a very difficult effort of showing womanly modesty in male attire. She was sweet and demure. She speaks her lines in scholarly fashion. Her pronunciation is charming. She is an excellent actress and is the possessor of a sweet soprano voice. She phrases her music with the best of taste.

Play a Taking One.

Marie Grandpre, the girl from Chicago, is a very taking little singer and actress; in fact, to specially mention each one of the cast would be only justice, for each played their part extremely well. The chorus girls are all young and really pretty, in fact it was the best balanced chorus that Medford has seen. The pretty ensemble was not marred by the bean girl who is sending money home to her mother to support two children.

Taken as a whole, the show bears the metropolitan stamp, and as long as we can get such companies, Medford will willingly put up the price to see the finest and the prettiest bunch of little lasses in history.
