CROWD APPLAUDS GANDIDATE CAKE

Statement No. 1 Finds Many Adherents in Audience Addressed by Senatorial Candidate-Scandals of Legislative Elections and Deadlocks.

A fair-sized andience turned out-orsday evening to hear H. M. Cake alk on political issues of the day. Mr. is a candidate for republican nom nation as United States senator to succeed Charles W. Fulton, and is making his campaign flatly upon Statement No. I, which provides for the popular elecion of senators.

Mr. Cake was introduced by W. I. He spoke at first upon nation d politics, advocating the poicies en-forced by President Roosevet. Then he turned his attention to Statement No. 1 and fully discussed it from all ciewpoints.

Mr. Cake read the history of some orial elections for the past 20 years, eave details about the numerous dead locks and the waste of public money and the scandals following almost every session in every state when a toga was the prize contested for.

The speaker went into details con-cerning the disgraceful scenes enacted the legislature failed to organize, of the numerous deadlocks and the forty days and forty nights of wasted efforts on the part of the people's representatives. He went over briefly the popular strug gle for the direct election of senators and announced his willingness to abide

by the will of the people.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordi-nance No. 145, entitled, "An Ordinance to prevent and prohibit female persons from entering, going or being in any saloon, barroom, tippling house or place where spirituous, malt, vinous or intoxicating fiquors of any kind are sold within the corporate limits of the City of Medford, Oregon," approved March 17, 1908, be, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as fol-

lows: "Section 1. Hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation engaged, either as owner or owners, proprietor or proprietors, agent or agents, employe or employes. in the running or carrying on of any saloon, barroom, tippling house or drinking place or other room or place of any kind or nature where spirituous mult, vinous or other intoxicating li quors or beer, wine or ale are sold of kept for sale within the corporate limits of the city of Medford, Oregon, to permit or allow any female person at any time to enter, go, come or be with in his or their place of business. som, house or place connected there with and adjoining or adjacent thereto, where such intoxicants are sold or kept or delivered after sale, and it shall be uniawful for any female person to en-ter, go, come or be within any such place at any time. 
