SPORTING NEWS.

No banquet will be given Forrest C. Smithson, the world's champion hurdler. He has gone to Corvallis to begin training and says that under no condition does he want the Multnomah club to honor him with a banquet at this time. Smithson wants to set a new mark in the greatest classic of all hurdle races, the 120 high-hurdle event. The record is held jointly by A. C. Kraenzlein and Smithson now at 9:15.15. The Portland boy has equaled it twice, and once at Notre Dame university he ran the distance in 15 seconds flat, but a wind was blowing at his back, and the A. A. U. officials refused to accept it as a new mark.

Lucien Lerolle, a noted French amateur billiardist, has announced his intention of entering the contest for the international amateur billiard championship, which will begin on April 25. Efforts are being made by the officers of the Association of Amateur Billiard Players which may result in another foreign entry before the date for closing the list, which has been set for April 14. It is given out that four top players, Calvin Demarest and Chas. R. Conklin of Chicago, Edward W. Gardener of Passaic, N. J., and J. Ferdinand Poggenberg of San Francisco will represent this country. As agreed with the French federation, the matches will be decided at 182 ballkline, each match to be 400 points, his will be an innovation in amateur billiards in this country.

Articles matching Battling Nelson and Joe Gans in a 20-round contest to be fought in San Francisco next month, have been signed by all parties concerned. Nelson, appearing as his own manager, and Ben Selig, for Gans, who is in the cast, quibbled over the weight before signing up, but finally agreed that Gans should weigh 133 pounds ringside and Nelson is not to make any specified weight. Gans closes his theatrical engagement inside of a week, and will then come to the coast to begin training.

Yields to Postcard Frenzy.
WASHINGTON, April 8.—As a result of numerous complaints of postals and postcards being defaced by postmarking, the postmaster-general has ordered discontinuance of the postmarking of cards at the office of address. The postal card had reached an enormous proportion and the new ruling is expected by postal officials to be received with delight by the thousands of collectors.

Expensive Cliff House.
Judge Coffey has announced from the bench in San Francisco that he would sign an order allowing \$10,000 to be taken from the Sutor estate to be used in rebuilding the Cliff House as soon as a satisfactory order was presented. This, with the \$47,000 insurance money formerly set aside for the purpose, will make a total of \$57,000 with which a reinforced concrete building will be erected.

PROCLAMATION.
Whereas, there was submitted to the voters of the City of Medford, Oregon, at a special election held for that purpose on April 2, 1908, a proposed amendment to Section 72 of the City Charter of said City of Medford, and Whereas, on the said 24 day of April, 1908, the city recorder, in my presence, of the City Council of said city, did canvass the votes given for and against the said amendment; and Whereas, it was ascertained and determined upon such canvass that there were 268 votes cast for and 22 votes cast against the said amendment, and that said amendment received an affirmative majority of the total number of effective votes cast thereon and entitled to be counted under the provisions of the law;
Now, therefore, I, B. J. Trowbridge, as acting mayor of the City of Med-

ford, Oregon, in the absence of the mayor from the city, in obedience to and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by law, do hereby make and issue this proclamation to the people of the City of Medford, and do announce and declare that the whole number of votes cast in the city of Medford at said election, for and against the said amendment, was as hereinbefore stated, and that the said amendment received the affirmative majority of the total number of votes cast thereon and entitled to be counted under the provisions of law, and that said amendment shall be and is in full force and effect from the date of this proclamation, and that the following is the full text of the said amendment:
Amendment to Section 72 of the City Charter of the City of Medford.

The People of the City of Medford do ordain as follows:
That Section 72 of an act of the legislature of the State of Oregon, entitled, "An act to repeal an act entitled, 'An act to repeal an act entitled, 'An act to incorporate the town of Medford, in Jackson county, Oregon, and limiting its powers and defining the duties of its officers,'" and to repeal an act entitled, "An act to incorporate the town of Medford, in Jackson county, Oregon," approved February 24, 1885," filed in the office of the secretary of state February 21, 1889, and all amendments thereof, and to incorporate the City of Medford, in Jackson county, Oregon, and to define its powers and duties, approved February 6, 1901, and to incorporate the City of Medford, in Jackson county, Oregon, define its powers and duties, and to repeal all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the secretary of state, February 7, 1905, as amended by the act amendatory thereof, filed in the office of the secretary of state, February 13, 1905, and as further amended by the vote of the people of Medford on June 4, 1907, and on March 17, 1908, be and the same is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following:

Subdivision D. In addition to the foregoing warrants and bonds, as authorized in the preceding subdivisions of this section, the said council is further authorized to borrow money on the faith of the city, and for that purpose to issue additional warrants and bonds for the sole purpose of securing, furnishing and installing a gravity supply of pure water for said city; but in the event that said council shall elect to secure, furnish and install a gravity supply of pure water as above mentioned, and shall issue warrants and bonds as provided in this subdivision for such purpose, the total amount of warrants and bonds so issued shall at no time exceed the sum of \$300,000, in addition to the warrants and bonds in the three preceding subdivisions authorized, and in the event that such warrants and bonds shall be issued, such issue shall be in all respects subject to the provisions and restrictions of Subdivision B of this section, except as to the maximum amount of such issue.

Thus done and proclaimed at Medford, Oregon, this 24 day of April, 1908.
