### Perry's RecitaL

The entertainment of last night by Edward Baxter Perry was a complete success, both from an artistic as well as a financial standpoint. The program consisted of well-known numbers by some of the best composers for plano, preceded by an explanatory talk on the authors and their compositions, which made the entertainment instructive as well as entertaining. Mr. Perry's er tertainment appeals rather to the stu-dent of music than to the general play goer, as it is strictly on the classic or-der, and it was gratifying to see so large an attendance at Medford's first attempt at high masic art.

Mr. Perry may be clussed with mod-enty among the few great plantics of this country, and in some respects he is well in the fore front. For instance, as a player of modelles, he takes first a place among the great artists. For haps he backs somewhat in magnetic fire. His playing is rather of the schedur 's han the wild abandon of his fellow artists. His interpretation of the melarchite, this incorporation in the mer-ancholy mode, of Schumann and the weird function of Chonin are perhaps its host. This Greig number was hardly a Thir spectrum of this great author's works. ''Lieberstraum'' and ''The Acolina," his own composition, were perhaps the most enjoyable numbers of the program. While Listt is the best known by his transcriptions, yet his original compositions are by far his most meritorious works.

Mr. Perry, as a composer, like all other great performers, shows the influ-ence of the works they have studied, perfuses to the detriment of their orig-matiry, but take it for all and in all, the entertainment was a most delightful-one, and is a step in the right direction oward the cultivation of higher art it Medford.

Ashland has a surplus of \$10,000 or more in its water fund, and the sur-plus is steadily growing from the re-ceipts for water rents, which amount to






