### ARABS DEFEATED BY FRENCH FORCES IN DESPERATE BATTLE

French Forces Posted at Talzeaza Hill Surprised by Victous Attack at Daylight-Twenty Eight Killed and 125 Berbers Lost Their Lives.

COLOMB RECHAR, Arabia, April Found Dead in His Hotel as Hill, commanding the plant of Tamiet, were surprised at daylight by a fleree attack of Berbers, who, with Nomad Arabs, have been conscitrating for ome weeks on the western frontier of Algeria. The French rallied and fought esperately and finally beat off their dversaries. The Arabs field abandon ng the dead and wounded. The French victory was costly, 28 being killed, 100 wounded. The Berbers lost 125 dead.
