Unable or unwilling to break the mysterious ties that hind him to the interests of J. Thorburn Ross, State Treasurer Steel couldn't remember the incidents concerning which the state wanted him to testify today in the case against the farmer president of the defunct Title Guarantee & Trust company

Steele told very readily of finding, when he took the office in January, 1907, that his predecessor had \$35,000 on deposit in this bank, but when he was asked about his own transactions his memory failed. His chief clerk had transacted nearly all the business, he said, and he could not remember havsaid, and he could not remember having talked with Ross about state deposits and could not recollect any conversation with Ross about the educational fund or about the law by means of which that enormous fund was turned over to the Ross bank without interest. Though he segregated the funds in the Ross bank when the new law went into effect and called one fund "educational," he did not remember ever having told the bank officials that this fund was made up of ials that this fund was made up of chool funds.


