STEER PROVES COSTLY WHEN TAKEN INTO CIRCUIT COURT

Circuit court has been in session at Grants Pass since the first of the week. There are a goodly number of cases on the equity side of the docket, including 16 divorce cases.

There is but one criminal case. It is of long-continued interest, in which A. Reynolds sued R. P. George for the recovery of a steer worth \$20. The matter was submitted a jury, which wrestled with the evidence for two days and one night, and in order to get a correct conclusion held the hide up before an electric light, and this act exposed a former brand underneath the present identification and threw the case to the defendant.

In the face of this also comes a cost bill in the justice court of \$74, as some of the witnesses had to travel a distance of 90 miles. The costs in the circuit court will bring a total of about \$200.

RESOLUTION

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Medford, Oregon, the Mayor approving, that there be, and is hereby called, a special election in said city for the purpose of submitting to the voters of said city for their approval or rejection, a proposed amendment to Section 100 of the City Charter of said city, and such other matters as may lawfully be brought up at said election; that said election be held upon the 9th day of May, 1908, between the hours of 9 a. m. and 5 p. m. of said day.

For the Second Ward—Polling place, sample room, Hotel Nash. Judge, V. J. Emorick. Judge and clerk, D. G. Karna. Judge and clerk, H. H. Harvey. For the Third Ward—Polling place, City Hall. Judge, A. T. Deisak. Judge and clerk, P. M. Stewart. Judge and clerk, C. E. Collins.
