ORDINANCE NO. 153.

An ordinance regulating the sale of orehandise from wagons, earts, vehicles or other pertable stands or ap paratus upon Seventh street and Cen tral avenue, in the City of Medford, Oregon, and providing penalty for the violation thereof.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Hereafter it shall be un-lawful in the City of Medford, Oregon, for any person, firm or corporation, either as proprietor or proprietors, ngent or agents, employe or employes engaged in selling or offering for sale any goods, wares or merchandise of any description whatever, from any wagon, eart, vehicle or other portable stand or apparatus, upon the streets of said city, to allow such wagon, eart, vehicle or other portable stand or apparatus from which such goods, wares or merchandise are sold or offered or exposed for sale to remain stationary at any place upon Seventh street or Central avenu said city, for a longer period of time than five minutes

Section 2. Any person, firm or co-poration convicted of violating the pra-tisions of Section 1 of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than five dol Seats now on sale at Haskins' drug lars, and in default of the payment of such fine shall be imprisoned in the
