There is no snow at the head of the canyon and none of Mount Pitt's melting snow finds its way in Wasson canyon, as it is not in its watershed. Willow creek, which is separated from Wasson canyon by a steep ridge, gets Mount Pitt drainage:

"Near the upper end of the canyon the water is warm and has a strong iron taste. There is a mud lake or lagoon about 300 or 100 yards long, 50 feet across, out of which a stream six inches wide ross. This water is already col-ored from stagnation. Half way up the six miles of canyon the stream has dwindled to 50 inches flow,

The water committee only went part way up this canyon. We saw their tracks. It is evident that in summer the total flow will not begin to equal even the 200 inches the city has contracted for, and Mr. Hamilley probably of his new irrigating ditch from Little
