RAILROAD GRANT ALREADY ABOUSES CUPIDITY

That the Oregon & California land grant, if recovered by the United States government, should be donated to the state of Oregon as an addition to the irredemible school fund is the opinion of Superintendent of Public Instruction Ackerman, who will head a movement to have the Oregon Legislature con-

sider take steps to have such a grant made as soon as the land has returned to the ownership of the United States. "No better disposition of the land could be made," said Superintendent Ackerman today in discussing his idea.

"The land was granted by the government to aid the development of the state of Oregon through the building of a railroad. The government fixed a maximum price and established other restrictions to the sale of the land. As I am informed, the railroad company sold part of the land for practically enough money to make up the total to which it would be entitled at the maximum rate on the whole grant.
