## BAND SAWS SUPPLANT THE CIRCULAR ONES

Many of the larger sawmills of Cali

ornin are now employing "hand' saws instead of circular saws. Hand saws are proving especially advantage ous in the sawing of big logs, as they do the work more quickly and with far less waste than the circular saws. These less waste than the circular saws. These band saws are long ribbons of steel, from six to eight inches in width, operated over large pulleys above and below, the upper pulley being located directly over the lower. The principle on which these saws operate is exactly like that of the small band saws employed in planning and finishing mills. The in planning and finishing mills. The saws are necessarily thin, and made of the very toughest steel. Each has a 000 feet, and requires from 25 to 40 per cent less power than circular saws of the same capacity. To prevent heating, a small stream of water is continu ally played upon the band saw, At first there was considerable hesitancy in adopting them, as they were considered extremely dangerous on necount of found, however, that there is no more saw, the band saw carries its own teeth, these being a part of the saw it self. Each mill must therefore be prosetting, while the other is at work
