The acreage being planted to small fruit is said, however, to be increasing faster than the increas in the manufacture of fruit boxes. Since if becomes possible to ship hoxes flat the mills on the Pavific const, using spruce humber, have been able to build up a splendid lusiness with easter fruit growers.
