Cherry Season On in San Joaquin.

LODGE, Cal., May 22.—The cherry season is now on in full force. The fruit is ripening fast and the packers are kept busy getting the fruit ready for the eastern markets. One of the finest markets in this locality is the Crump orchard in the valley east of Atascadero, which has been leased this season by the Red Fruit Company. A. E. Humprey, the local representative of that company, says that earlier lots of 2000 boxes will be grading \$1000 to \$1500 in New York and Chicago markets.
