

### COMPLAINT OVER POOR HIGHWAYS

Gold Hill News Voices Protest of Tax Over Continued Neglect of County Roads About City—Only Fifty Dollars Needed to Put Road in Shape.

A great deal of complaint concerning the road between Gold Hill and the Foothills district is now being heard on the streets of this place every day, and it seems that from all appearances the complaints are certainly just ones, says the Gold Hill News. In two places the road has been changed to give way to the rapid growth of the country, and in each place, aside from merely cutting a path through the thick growth of underbrush, nothing has been done to make the high passable. In the first instance, when the owners of the Riverside Park addition to Gold Hill had their tract of land surveyed and placed on the market the road had to be placed in its right position, but other than cutting down some trees the county court did nothing. The road along this point is almost impassable, and instead of using the road, the people are compelled to turn out at a place where, if one who is not familiar with the road, he takes a big chance of upsetting his wagon, and otherwise breaking things up in general. The expenditure of \$50 on this stretch of road would make it in very good condition, yet nothing has been done at all. Now, is this fair to the people of this section? Do we not pay enough taxes into the treasury of Jackson county to be entitled to this small sum of money, \$50? Are we to be treated in this manner in order that a more favored section of the county may enjoy its good roads and increased values of property? The people of this section of Jackson county are growing tired of the way in which they have been treated in the matter of road building, and they will certainly express that feeling on the first day of June. This is not a political item, but is merely the expression of the sentiment of the good people who are compelled to traverse the roads mentioned, and it was written at the request of these people. Judge Dunn, it's up to you.

### CALIFORNIA HORSES ON WAY TO SEATTLE RACES

For the past two or three days the northern trains have been carrying blooded horses to the northwest circuit from California. Tuesday four cars of racers passed through Medford. Altogether there will be 60 horses from California, representing every stable of importance with two exceptions. The coming racing season is to be the greatest the northwest has ever looked upon. Animals from all western states are entered as well as many from Canada. The stakes are the biggest ever. In the 2:09 trot there will be the most evenly matched set of horses in the west. Among them are Athashan, 2:09 1/4, who ran in the money on the grand circuit last year against Scoumum Girl and Higball, both with records of 2:05 1/4; North Star, 2:11 1/4, who ran second in the Salem stake last summer; R. Ambush, 2:11 1/4, who captured that event; Fresno Girl, 2:10 1/4, entered on the California circuit; Wild Bell, 2:08 1/4, a grand circuit performer. The pacers will include Mona Wilkes, 2:06 1/4; Queen Pomona, 2:07 1/4; Harry Hogan, 2:12 1/4; Charlie D., a great pacer which ran second to Sir John S., 2:05 1/4; John R. Conway, 2:09 1/4; Kelly Briggs, 2:08 1/4, and Miss Idaho, 2:09 1/4. All of these horses will be entered in the same stakes, making the finish an unusually close one.
