We, thesocialists of Jackson county,

by endorse the principles of socialism as embodied in the state and national platforms of the socialist party.

We realize that society is divided into two distinct classes and that the class struggle is a conflict over the division of the product of labor. This conflict must ever exist as long as the present private ownership of the means of producing the necessities of life

We declare our aim to be the organigation of the working classes and those in sympathy with them into a political party for the purpose of capturing the powers of government in order that the producing classes may receive the full products of their labor. But in order that the workers may the sooner gain political control, we favor all immediate measures which will aid them in this conflict. As a means to this end we favor the following measures:

#### Demands of Socialists.

First-We demand that all property sessed at its full cash value, and be assessed at its full cash value, and that we favor a graduated income tax. Second—We defind the re-enactment of the householders' exemption law, whereby \$500 worth of personal proper-ty shall be exempt from taxation. Third—We favor the levying of a

special tax for the purpose of maintaining good ronds throughout the county and that 50 per cent of the money secured by said tax shall be used on

Fourth-We favor the public construction of electric power plants for the purpose of supplying heat, light and power, and the construction of electric railways for the means of transporta-

Tenth-We pledge our candidates, if elected, to sign a blank resignation, to be filled and presented at any time they fail to work for the principles of so-cialism as embodied in this platform.
