POOR PRICES DUE TO GREED OF DEALERS

Oregon Apple Growers Expect Good Prices the Coming Season—Inferior Fruit Put in Storage by Speculators Cause of Depression in Market.

Oregon apple growers are not worrying because of the condition of the apple market in the east, which is at a low ebb.

Poor Apples in Storage. With the storage plants bulging with inferior apples, the dealers waited until the high-class fruits were thrown on the market.

Dealers Well Stung. "I think the dealers are pretty well satisfied now that they have been stung good and plenty," said Mr. Vanderhill.

Another thing that hurt the market was the large crops. This year, from accounts I have been reading, the apple belt in the middle west has been damaged fully 50 per cent by heavy frosts.

When the eastern buyers land at Hood River they will have to meet our prices. The Fruitgrowers' union of Hood River is building a large cold storage plant, large enough to store the big apple crop that is coming on, and if the prices are not right our apples will be stored right at home and sold when the market is right.

PLAN TO OPPOSE ADVANCE OF RAILROAD FREIGHT RATES

SEATTLE, Wash., June 3.—Following closely upon the heels of the big gathering of commercial bodies of every description, commercial clubs, chambers of commerce, manufacturers, wholesalers and retailers' associations to the number of 56, who met in Chicago May 15 to formulate a plan of action to head off the threatened 10 per cent advance in freight rates, the freight rate committee of which C. F. White is chairman and A. P. Specht is secretary, representing the combined interests of west coast lumber manufacturers and shingle mills' bureau, has just issued to more than 2000 eastern correspondents a confidential letter on transportation policy, which outlines a plan for effectively opposing an advance in freight rates.

Briefly, the letter calls upon business interests all over the country to join in requesting delegates to both the republican and democratic national conventions to support the following article of political faith and to see that it is made a plank in the platforms of both political parties.

SUICIDES IN CITIES SHOW AN ALARMING INCREASE

CHICAGO, June 3.—The revised report of the Chicago bureau of statistics compiled from the records of 37 leading cities show an alarming increase in the number of suicides, particularly within the last four months. The most appalling feature of the report is the statistical commentary on the self-inflicted deaths of the young.
