Direct primaries, popular election of senators, initiative and referendum have come to stay. Each election the people increase their authority.

NO MORE JUNE STATE ELECTIONS

Laws Passed by the People in Effect. Recall—Strengthens Statement No. 1. Both Fishery Bills Probably Passed. Woman's Suifrage Defeated.

SALEM, Or., June 5.—The constitutional amendments and bills adopted by the people at the election last Monday will go into effect as soon as the vote thereon can be canvassed and the result proclaimed by the governor.

Recall Effective at Once. The recall amendment is self-executory and will be effective at once. It provides that 25 per cent of the voters of an election may compel an officer to stand for re-election at a special election to be held within 29 days.

No More June Elections. The act instructing members of the legislature to vote for the people's choice for senator will, of course, never be effective as an imperative law, but as a moral influence upon the legislature its significance will be determined next January.
