Would Restrain County Court from Declaring Prohibition in Effect in City.

Action was begun today to prevent Medford, as provided under the city charter. A temporary injunction was applied for from Circuit Judge Hanna by Attorney Robert G. Smith, representing J. C. Hall, to restrain the county court from declaring prohibition in effect in Medford, as provided under the local option law. It is expected that the prohibitionists will seek to dis-

The charter's clause under which ac tion is brought reads as follows:

"The city council shall have power and authority within the city limits of Medford to license, tax, regulate or pro-hibit barrooms, drinking shops, billiard rooms, howling alleys, dance halls, and all places where spiritous, malt or vinous liquors are sold or kept for sale, irrespective of any general law of the state on this subject enacted by the legislature or by the people at large."
