Big Bill Uniformly Successful in Landing Delegates From Contested States--Entire South for Ohioan--Tea and Taffy for a Woman's Suffrage Plank --- Odell out for Vice Presidency-Tariff Plank

CHICAGO, June 11.—Enough pledged Taft delegates to insure his non-ination on the first ballor had been placed on the temperary roll of the convention when the national committee endorsed the contests in the First and Fifth districts of South Carolina by scatting the Taft mon.

Former Governor Benjamin B. Odell of New York was brought forward today as a new candidate for the vice-presidential nomination. Calvin J. McKuight, Odell's confidential secretary and representative in political matters.
