Charged with perjury, James D. Ha-reiwood of Medford was todged in the Multnomah county jail yesterday in de-fault of \$200 bonds, states the Portland Oregonian of June 24. The recent federal grand jury returned an indictment ngainst Hazelwood, charging him with perjury in making application for a omestend in Jackson county in July.

In the investigation of the charge against Hazelwood, B S. Reams of Jack son county was the complaining witness It was represented by Reams that he was the owner of a mining claim that had been worked satisfactority for probably for 15 years, and that Hazelwood. John R. Helman to Sarah R. Fox, property in Ashland Thomas J. Downing to Charles knowing the facts, made application be fore A. S.Bliton, United tSates commis sioner, to file on the land as a home stead, subscribing to a non-mineral af-fidavit in support of the application. Later Hazelwood relinquished his claim never attempted to make final

Numerous instances of this character had been called to the attention of United tSates Attorney McCourt, who con-cluded to present the facts before the grand jury for its consideration. The result was that a number of indict ments were returned and Hazelwood was included among the defendants. The practice of these men, t is alleged was to seek to acquire possession avaluable mineral lands by filing on the same as homesteads. In order to do so same as nonextents. In order to do so it was necessary to subscribe to a non-mineral affidavit, declaring that the land was non-mineral and not suited for mining pursaits. By this process several instances were reported in which min-ing claims were jumped and the original owners were ousted from their holdings

KLAMATH WETS FIGHT DRY CITY

Since the decision of Judge Hanna granting a perminent injunction against the county court of Jackson county in the matter of declaring the city of Med-ford prohibition moder the local option law there has been a movement among the saloon men of this city to start legal proceedings that would prohibit the county court from declaring the city of Klamath Falls prohibition under the local option law in accordance with the vote of the county at the recent elec-tion, states the Klamath Falls Herald

The first step in this direction was taken yesterday when Keni Ballard and A. Castel, through their attorneys, F. H. Mills and A. L. Lenvitt, filed a peti tion in the circuit court asking writ of review, making County Judge Griffith and Commissioner Fred Mel hase the defendants. The writwill com-before Judge Beuson as soon as he car find time to take up the matter, and this will likely be before the first slay of July, as according to the order of the county court prohibition goes into effect. The outcome of the case will be watched with much interest. The matter of granting the writ will in itself not stop prohibition from going into effect, but if the writ is granted it is very probable that a restraining order will be is sued, and if this done the calcons will continue business until the matter is

In the petition are set forth a number of reasons why the writ should be granted, but chief among ithem is that the local option law is superseded by the charter of the city of Kinmath Falls. June of 1994, while the city charter wa not enacted until the following year

HIGHER LIGHT RATES

The electric light company, from its head office at Yreka, Cal. has issued a new schedule of lighting rates for Ashland to become effective July 20. The new schedule amounts to a doubling of charges for lighting service in some instances and an increase of

frim 10 to 40 per cent all along the line. Teh new rates are based on 16 candle power lamps, per month, and a smalle power lamps or less will hereafter take the same charge as a 16 candle power which is also in effect an increase of rates, for at present 8 candle power lamps are rated at 2-3 of 16s.

Under the new domests chedgle one lamp will be \$1, two lamps \$1.27, four \$1,40, six \$1.70, ten \$2.30 and thirteen or more 20e each.
