

HAZELWOOD IN DURANCE VILE

Medford Man Lodged in Multnomah County Jail Charged With Perjury in Land Filing.

Charged with perjury, James D. Hazelwood of Medford was lodged in the Multnomah county jail yesterday in default of \$200 bonds, states the Portland Oregonian of June 24. The recent federal grand jury returned an indictment against Hazelwood, charging him with perjury in making application for a homestead in Jackson county in July, 1906.

In the investigation of the charge against Hazelwood, B. S. Reams of Jackson county was the complaining witness. It was represented by Reams that he was the owner of a mining claim that had been worked satisfactorily for probably for 15 years, and that Hazelwood, knowing the facts, made application before A. S. Bliton, United States commissioner, to file on the land as a homestead, subscribing to a non-mineral affidavit in support of the application. Later Hazelwood relinquished his claim and never attempted to make final proof.

Numerous instances of this character had been called to the attention of United States Attorney McCourt, who concluded to present the facts before the grand jury for its consideration. The result was that a number of indictments were returned and Hazelwood was included among the defendants. The practice of these men, it is alleged, was to seek to acquire possession of valuable mineral lands by filing on the same as homesteads. In order to do so it was necessary to subscribe to a non-mineral affidavit, declaring that the land was non-mineral and not suited for mining pursuits. By this process several instances were reported in which mining claims were jumped and the original owners were ousted from their holdings.

KLAMATH WETS FIGHT DRY CITY

Since the decision of Judge Hanna granting a permanent injunction against the county court of Jackson county in the matter of declaring the city of Medford prohibition under the local option law there has been a movement among the saloon men of this city to start legal proceedings that would prohibit the county court from declaring the city of Klamath Falls prohibition under the local option law in accordance with the vote of the county at the recent election, states the Klamath Falls Herald. The first step in this direction was taken yesterday when Kent Ballard and A. Castel, through their attorneys, F. H. Mills and A. L. Leavitt, filed a petition in the circuit court asking for a writ of review, making County Judge Griffith and Commissioner Fred Melhase the defendants. The writ will come before Judge Benson as soon as he can find time to take up the matter, and this will likely be before the first day of July, as according to the order of the county court prohibition goes into effect. The outcome of the case will be watched with much interest. The matter of granting the writ will in itself not stop prohibition from going into effect, but if the writ is granted it is very probable that a restraining order will be issued, and if this done the saloons will continue business until the matter is finally settled.

In the petition are set forth a number of reasons why the writ should be granted, but chief among them is that the local option law is superseded by the charter of the city of Klamath Falls. The local option law was enacted in June of 1904, while the city charter was not enacted until the following year.

This places the case practically on a par with that of Medford, except that the charter of this city does not contain the clause delegating to the city the power to regulate, license and prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors regardless of any other state law. The appendix, "regardless of any other state law" is not affixed to the clause in the charter for Klamath Falls. The petition cites error on the part of the county court in making the order for the local option election and also in declaring the result of the election.

ASHLAND MUST PAY HIGHER LIGHT RATES

The electric light company, from its head office at Yreka, Cal., has issued a new schedule of lighting rates for Ashland to become effective July 20. The new schedule amounts to a doubling of charges for lighting service in some instances and an increase of from 10 to 40 per cent all along the line. The new rates are based on 16 candle power lamps, per month, and 8 candle power lamps or less will hereafter take the same charge as a 16 candle power, which is also in effect an increase of rates, for at present 8 candle power lamps are rated at 2-3 of 16.

Under the new domestic electric one lamp will be \$1, two lamps \$1.25, four \$1.40, six \$1.70, ten \$2.20 and thirteen or more 25c each.
