RESCUE KIDNAPPED GIRL AFTER BATTLE

LEADER OF BANDITS JOINS POSSE IN RESCUING GIRL. THEN ESCAPES AND IS SURROUNDED

FATHER OF YOUNG OUTLAW AIDS IN CAPTURE OF SON

Pretty Girl Taken to Lonely Hut in Mountains Is Rescued and Tells Story of Capture--Officers Have Desperado Surrounded in Hills and Fight Is On--Dramatic Recital of the Kidnapping.

COALINGA, Cal., July 1.—Tony Lovell, driving a few miles, during which time Lovell continually repeated threats to kill me unless \$5000 ransom was paid before 8 o'clock Tuesday night, they allowed paper to alight.

Captured in Lonely Canyon. Cleve Rogers, the younger kidnapper, who was captured last night by a posse, after being traced to a lonely mountain cabin, and after using the girl as a shield against bullets from his pursuers, is in jail here.

Kidnapper Joined Posse. Feeling has been increased by the discovery today that when Lovell sent Rogers ahead with the girl he fell back and joined the posse, avoiding suspicion until the girl was rescued.

Girls Tell Her Story. The beautiful girl is a graduate of Holy Cross college at Santa Cruz and has many attainments and sweet traits of character which have endeared her to the community.
