CHANGES IN LAND

OFFICE METHODS

Important changes in the method of keeping records relating to the public lands went into effect July 1. These changes are the result of an investigation made by Mr. Garfield after his appointment as secretary of the inte-

A separate series of numbers for each class of entries has been in use at the district land office such as the home-stead series (original, home-stead series (final), desert hand series, mineral se ries, etc. Applications and entries were only numbered when allowed or approved. Under the new system each district land office will maintain but one series of numbers for all kinds of entries. Applications and entries will be numbered at the same and in the order in which they are presented or received at the district land offices, before they are considered for the pur pose of allowance or rejection. This will permit of a ready determination of the priority of filing of each applica

Receipts for All Money.

Another important change is in the method of issuing receipts for money paid to receivers. Applicants and entry men heretofore have been compelled to tender money with their applications and entries, and no receipt would issue until it was determined whether the

application or entry could be allowed Many applicants seriously objected to the depositing of their money without some form of acknowledgment of its re-ceipt. A new form of receipts has been adopted. These receipts are seriall numbered, before coming into the hand of receivers, with one series of num hers for all receivers. Press capies are made of all receipts issued, and for warded to the general dand office at the end of each month. All persons tendering moneys to receivers will here after be given a receipt therefor at the time the money is tenderd.

New Forms of Blanks.

Blanks for thre cturns and second of local offices to the general land office have been reduced to a uniform size to accommodate the ordinar size (ypewriting machines, Heretofore these blanks have been of large, unwields size, which necessitated making them out by pen and ink, and in numero cases the local offices were compelled cases the local offices were competied to practically suspend business anti-their mouthly and quarterly reports were completed Local officers were compelled under the old practice to duplicate for the sparrier all that had rpe-viously been reported each month.
