Rickard Deposits \$10,000 to Guarantee Purse for Gans-Nelson Nevada Meet

ELY, Nev., July 18.—Tex Rickard today left for Salt Lake to see the officials of the Oregon Short Line about special rates from Salt Lake and Ogden to Ely for the coming fight between Battling Nelson and Joe Gans on Labor day for the lightweight championship of the world.

Rickard deposited \$10,000 last night to guarantee the rest of the \$30,000 purse, conditional upon being granted rates for the fight by the railroads.

Battling Nelson and Willis Britt are looking about for training quarters today.

They are going to get acquainted with the country and then train right here for the coming battle. The latter is a favorite. He and his trainer, Willis were met by a brass band at the depot last night and escorted to their hotel.

Tex Rickard was on hand, having come 325 miles in an automobile in 11 hours so as not to have the fight declared off on account of failure to post his promised purse.
