THE WATER OUESTION.

The city council is to be commended for bringing the water question to a head. Advertising for bids will certainly bring out any opposition there is, and if the opposition is not forthcoming, a water supply of some sort is as sured within a year.

The Tribune does not think that the heavy property owners have taken sufficient interest in this question, but they must wake up now, or it will be too late. The majority of residents are so anxious for water that they will jump

The Tribune has frequently expressed its views in favor of publicity on the water question. Many have deliberately chosen to misconstrue these appeals to let the public know what was transpiring into personal attacks upon the water committee. There was and is nothing personal in them.

The Tribune believes that more harm has been done and is being done the water project by the policy of secrecy and vagabond, with nowhere to lay his than gould be accomplished in any other way. What if than could be accomplished in any other way. What if the policy does save the city a little money in the way of that is wasted on dogs. rights-of-way, etc! It cannot save much. The law permits condemnation by municipalities to prevent grasping individuals from holding up the people.

The water committee now asks for bids for a pipeline from the city to Wasson canyon or the north fork of the from the city to Wasson canyon or the north fork of the Little Butte. There may be some special object in keeping the source selected secret, announcement of which might damage the pending deals, which, of course, would justify the committee.

Those who are not in on the deal can only surmist. Imaginaton have always been the hand maids of progress? Had our forbears been contented in revolutionary times we might now be paying tribute to King Edward under the exploiting regime of England instead of King Graft in the hands of exploiting Americans.
