Ten people were hurt, three seriously, when a heavy electric car loaded to the steps with workmen on their way down town, ran away down a steep grade on Connecticut street early today, and dashed around a sharp curve with such velocity that the passengers were thrown in the street.

The weight of the car kept it on the rails and prevented further disaster.
