

POLICE UNABLE TO FIND DORR

Involved Broker Has Disappeared-Watching Ports to keep him in U. S.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., August 7.—Chief of Police Biggy has been unable today to find Frederick Dorr, the involved San Francisco, Chicago and New York broker, for whose arrest on a charge of felony embezzlement a warrant was issued yesterday afternoon.

Dorr left on the coast line train for Los Angeles four minutes after the warrant was issued, and when the train was searched at San Jose the man was not aboard. The warrant was sworn to by Captain H. H. Norwood, a mining broker, who alleges that Dorr sold and appropriated to his own use 100 shares of Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railroad stock valued at \$14,000.

Chief Biggy said today that Dorr had not been found by any of his men, who are looking for the missing financier.

Friend Defends Him.
F. H. Lathrop, one of the business associates of Frederick Dorr, the missing broker, today said:

"There is no reason whatever to think Mr. Dorr is trying to avoid service under the warrant issued yesterday. Before he left yesterday he called up Chief of Police Biggy and asked if there would be any complications which would interfere with his departure. That was before the warrant was issued, and the chief told him there would not be. It was my understanding that he was going directly to Los Angeles to work on his books, and if he has not arrived in that city I am sure he will turn up soon. There would be no reason for him to try to hide, and I am certain that he was merely stopped somewhere on private business."

Office in Los Angeles.
LOS ANGELES, Cal., August 7.—No word has been received here of the whereabouts of Frederick Dorr, the missing broker, by either members of his family or business associates. His office in the Bradbury block was besieged today by excited clients, who allege that the broker owes them large sums of money and who threaten to institute proceedings against him as soon as he is located by the police.

Detectives Hoosick and Ziegler have been haunting the railroad stations here on the lookout for Dorr and say they are certain that he has not entered the city. The police believe that he is in hiding somewhere near San Francisco and that he will not attempt to come to Los Angeles.

ROUMANIAN ARMY IS ROTTEN TO THE CORE

VIENNA, August 7.—Military circles are startled today by the results of an investigation following a report from Major Sturdza, the premier's son, charging shocking immorality, drunkenness, reckless extravagance and gambling among the officers of the Roumanian army and utter inefficiency throughout the rank and file. When the young major made these astounding declarations some time ago the ministry immediately ordered a general inspection and the findings of the committee delegated to investigate found evidence to amply bear out the charges.

Discipline in the army appears to be entirely lacking. There are practically no regulations and the accounts of the commissariat reveal extensive frauds, the officers in command having filled their pockets with public funds.

As a consequence of his remarkable disclosures, Major Sturdza had been called upon by a score of prominent army officers to fight duels. He has already met and vanquished seven of his antagonists.

CANNIBALS ON VERGE OF ANOTHER INSURRECTION

LISBON, August 7.—The cannibal population of Portuguese Guinea is on the verge of another insurrection, according to news brought here today by a vessel from the southwest coast of Africa.

The reports indicate that Bissau is now practically in a state of siege, as the manasters have marshaled a threatening force outside the walls awaiting the governor's decision. It is feared the authorities finally will be forced to yield, although the governor had steadfastly stood out against the enraged natives for several weeks.

Should the natives take the town, pillage and bloodshed would inevitably result. Every preparation has been made to resist the impending onslaught of the black hordes, but the situation is admitted to be a crisis.

Detailed reports of the rescue of European inhabitants of Bissau by the French cruiser Cassard are beginning to drift in.

The two has been sorely beset by the warring natives for many days, ammunition was running low, civilians and even women were fighting alongside the small garrison of 200 Portuguese soldiers. Just at this crisis the Cassard happened to stop at the port, and under her guns the natives were forced to fall back.

The natives have recovered from their fright at the guns of the warship and are again surrounding the city.

SPORTING NEWS

The Beavers were blanked in the first game played with the Seals on the grounds of the latter on Tuesday.

The record game for length was played at Portland Sunday, when the Beavers and Seals played 29 innings. The game finally went to the visitors, through the error of Ryan, by a score of 6 to 5. Graney and Sutor were the opposing pitchers.

The great work of the Detroit team has been a surprise, as few predicted the Tigers making such a fight for the pennant after falling before the Cubs last fall.

Helen Narte, the speedy little mare owned by Judge Brents of Walla Walla, Wash., died at Bushville, Ind., Saturday from an attack of bowel trouble. Helen had been working on the grand circuit and had a record of 2:09 1/2, although she lowered this mark in Cleveland in 1906 by going it in 2:06 1/2. Judge Brents recently refused \$5000 for the animal, who was a granddaughter of the noted Altamont.

Los Angeles is playing winning ball right along and is nearly 40 points ahead of Portland. San Francisco is third, while Oakland is still in possession of the cellar.

In the American league has arisen a new star—one that will be shining brightly when that of the mighty Wagner has set. Today it is a question which is the more brilliant—Wagner or Cobb of Pittsburgh. Cobb, demon batsman, demon base runner and wonderful fielder, of the Detroit Americans, is only 22 years old. He is the fastest man in the American league. He is hitting at a terrific clip. He is as graceful as a deer and as strong as a lion. He was a sensation last year, he is a marvel now. Between Hans and Ty Cobb there is little to choose. Their hitting, their base running, their fielding are about even. Just two drawbacks has Cobb—a quick temper and a tendency to "swelled head."

STRIKE SITUATION ON CANADIAN ROAD QUIET

VANCOUVER, B. C., August 7.—William Whyte, second vice-president of the Canadian Pacific Railroad company, when asked today if he had anything to say concerning the rate war, shook his head and said that the matter is in the hands of the local officials. When further questioned, as to whether he cared to comment on the strike situation, he slightly relaxed after a moment of reflection, and said:

"We really have nothing to say about it. It is not our plan to talk or act in the matter. When the conciliation committee made its rulings I telegraphed to Ottawa from Winnipeg and told them that their findings were not, from our point of view, satisfactory, but that, in order to keep the spirit of the conciliation act, we would agree to them."

The plain inference from Mr. Whyte's comment seemed to be that, inasmuch as the conciliation committee had given a ruling, and the men had gone out on strike, it was up to the commission to look after the enforcement of its own rulings.

The situation here is quiet today.

LUCIEN YOUNG TO BE MARE ISLAND COMMANDANT

WASHINGTON, August 7.—Captain Lucien Young is to be the new commandant at Mare Island navy yard, San Francisco, according to advices given out by the navy department. He will succeed Captain J. B. Milton, who has been transferred to command of the recruiting ship Independence, now at Mare Island.

Commodore J. M. Robinson, who has been in command of the Independence, is relieved and has returned to his home.

SHEEP DISEASE CLAIMS A BOY FOR VICTIM

NEW YORK, August 7.—Surgeons at the Harlem hospital today are holding an autopsy over the remains of William Bienz, a 16-year-old boy, who died of anthrax, a sheep disease, last night.

This is the first case of the kind ever reported in Harlem, and the doctors are studying its singular phases.

At first it was thought that a mosquito had bitten the boy, but as the disease developed, it was discovered that he was suffering from the sting of an insect which is usually found on the sheep in Russia.

NEW TURKISH CABINET NAMED BY SULTAN

CONSTANTINOPLE, August 7.—The new Turkish cabinet was named today by the sultan, acting under the direction of Kiamil Pasha. There is not a single reactionary in the cabinet, which is composed of men wholly out of sympathy with the old regime.

This is considered as a guarantee that the new constitution will be observed to the letter and there is great rejoicing among the members of the Young Turks party.

CARDINAL GIBBONS RECOVERS FROM ILLNESS

ROME, August 7.—Cardinal Gibbons has entirely recovered from the attack of intestinal trouble that made it necessary for him to go to bed yesterday, according to reports received here today. The cardinal is receiving guests and listening to the congratulations of his friends on the short duration of his illness. He expects to appear at the closing tomorrow.
