LOOK BEFORE LEAPING.

Before the water committee irrevocably ties up the city in its contract for pipeline and water from the north fork of the Little Butte or Wasson canyon the proposition to bring water from the Little Applegate should be thoroughly investigated.

Only three things are to be considered by the city: quantity, quality and price.

The Little Applegate proposition is for 500 inches against 300 inches from the north fork of the Little Butte or from Wasson canyon.

In quality, the Little Applegate is equal or superior to any water in the country.

In price, the Little Applegate is \$250,000, including 500 inches of water, interest in conduit and ownership of reservoir and pipeline.

It is therefore due to the citizens of Medford that the committee have its engineer go over the Applegate proposition thoroughly, for in cost, quality and quantity, it makes more than a favorable comparison with the proposed system.
