ENTIRE CONTRACT LET FOR ROAD TO KLAMATH

KLAMATH PALLS, August 13.-Klamath Falls is about to experience the netual results from the approach of the actual results from the approach of the milroad. Heretofore all construc-tion work done on the California North-castern has been too remote from this city to bring any direct benefits to the business men of Khunath Palls, but now comes the announcement by to room of the East Treuton machine but now comes the announcement by the railroad officials that the contract for the construction of the entire read to this city, including borris tunnel and the big cut north of this city, has been let to Erickson & Petesron and within a few weeks a partion of their large mutiit is to be brought to this end of the line to make the big cut and to use the diet in filling in the yards and in the construction of the roadbed between this city and the marsh. Erickson & Peterson are the contractors who have built most of marsh. Erickion & Peterson are the contractors who have built most of the road and the awarding of the con-tract to them of the remainder of the line, with the exception of the marsh work, shows that when E. The pro-posal is wholly impracticable unless it is to be ascompanied by a complete revolution in our banking system, with supervision so close as practically to create a government bank. If the propo-

We are supposed to have government supervision of na-tional banks now. But now that it is proposed that depositors generally shall have some such assuronce for the safe keeping of their ance for the sate according wealth, we are told by the ropublican candidate for the presidency that the adoption of such a plan "would bring the whole banking system of the coun
