KLAMATH FALLS, Or., August 19.—Indians on the Klamath reservation had a big day last Saturday, when for the first time in their history they held an election according to the modes of the white man.

The reservation has been divided into 12 districts and one representative was elected from each division for one year. Those elected together with the tribes to which they belong, are as follows:

That for the sole purpose of securing, furnishing and installing a gravity supply of pure water in and for said city, the negotiable coupon bonds of the said city shall be issued to the amount of two hundred and ninety-two thousand dollars (\$292,000) to be known as the Gravity Water Supply Bonds of 1908...

of \$1000 each, numbered from one (1) to two hundred ninety-two (292), inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of January and July in each year...
