RAISING OF SMALL FRUITS IN OREGON

C. L. Lewis, in a bulletin of the Or-

gon agricultural college, says:
We have in Oregon ideal condition for growing small fenits to perfection and this industry should become as important one in our herticultural development. Already the state has a apleudid reputation along this line and our small fruits are noted for their re-markable shipping qualities. With the development of more markets, the building of additional countries and syrup factories, the domand will increme vory materially. There is not a county the state but can grow so me or all of the small fruits to perfection.

There are so many varieties of straw

berries that almost any of our soil will produce some of them well, al-though for the lest development they like a rich, moist soil, that is well trained In western Oregon subsoils containing considerable clay are desirable, while in eastern Oregon this is not so necessary, an irrigation is penerally resorted to but all strawberry should contain a good supply of humes In regions that are just being devel oped by irrigation better results are obtained if some other crops are grow followed by putatoes and strawberries, sod lands, as these may contain injurious massis. Regions that are subjected to frosts should be avoided. Narrow valleys where the gold air settles. are apt to be frosty.

The success of strawberry growing, kind of plants, good preparation and cultivation of the soil, proper setting anad the choice of the right variety.

The whole ountry over it has always been the rule that a very large majority of the fruit trees are planted to fail of results There are always many times the number of fruit trees which would be need ed to supply all possible demands if they had been planted with good judg sent and received the proper care. it is, the supply of really marketable fruit does not often exceed the demand As land becomes more valuable are farming more intensive and scientific his condition will gradually pass away of growing and marketing fruits will in time take the business of raising fruit for market from the districts where the rate of progress is slower.
