Mediford Not Alone in Having a Bothersome Water Problem to Contend With

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Sept. 12.-The board of supervisors of San Franelseo finds itself in a peculiar situation today in the much mooted proposition to bring water from th Nierra Nevada to bring water from the Storra Nevada mountains to supply the city. The Spring Valley Water company, which furnishes the city water at present, an-nounces itself as a competitor with the Hetch Hetchy properties. The Spring Valley officials have been quietly buy ing up considerable Sierra property and water rights for some time and now comes forth the charter proposition that the supervisors must ask for valuations on existing plants before par-

chasing water supply plants. The supervisors may have to abandon the Hetch Hetchy project and take the Navada county properties that the Spring Valley company has under con-trol.






