### The Recall Law.

The recall law reads us follows: Section 18. Every public officer in Oregon is subject, as herein provided, to recall by the legal votors of the state or of the electoral district from which he is elected. There may be required 25 per cent, but not more, of the number of electors who voted in his district at the preceding election for justice of the supreme court to file their petition demanding his recall by the people They shall set forth in said petition the reasons for said demand. If he shall offer his resignation, it shall be necepted and take effect on the day it offered, and the vacancy shall b filled as may be provided by law, If he shall not resign within five days after the petition is filed, a special election shall be ordered to be held with in 20 days in his said electoral district to determine whether the people will

Print Reasons for Recall.

On the sample ballot at said election shall be printed in not more than 20 words, the reasons for demanding the recall of said officer as set forth in the recall petition, and in not more than 200 words the officer's justification of his course in office. He shall contin to perform the duties of his office until the result of said special election shall be officially declared. Other candidates for the office may be nominated to be voted for at said special election. The candidate who shall receive the highest number of votes shall be deemed elected the remainder of the term, whether if be the person against whom the re-call petition was filed or another.

The recall petition shall be filed with the officer with whom a petitic nomination to such office should be filed, and the same officer shall order the special election when it is required. No such patition shall be circulated officer until he has act ually held his office mx months, say and except that it may be filed agains n senator or representative in the leg islative assembly at any time after five days from the beginning of the

No Double Recall. After one such petition and special election, no further recall petition shall be filed against the same officer dur-ing the term for which he was elected unless such further petitioners shall first pay into the public treasury which has paid such special election expenses, the whole amount of its expenses for the preceding special election.
