**BRYAN IN ACTION.**  
 Splendid Exhibition Promised at the Grand Tonight.  
 William Jennings Bryan, Democrat, is candidate for the greatest office in the gift of the American people, during his visit to Chicago on Labor day, passed before the moving picture machine. The photographing was done by Bell, and it is a marvel of perfection, interest and clearness. Every move made by Mr. Bryan, his walk, his gestures while speaking, his genial smile, his cheery hand waving—all these are shown with such startling distinctness that when the picture was first shown to Herman E.
