SUFFRAGETTES GO WILD

RUSH POLICE WAGON, SCREAMING AND WITH HAIR AND CLOTHES DISHEVELLED--MANY ARE TAKEN TO JAIL--REFUSE TO MAKE PROMISES TO END RIOTING

WOULD STOP WAR WORDS

MIKADO ISSUES EDICT CALLING ON JAPANESE PEOPLE TO CULTIVATE FRIENDLY RELATIONS WITH AMERICA--MEANS DOWN ON NEW ERA IN ORIENT

TOKIO, Oct. 14.—The arrival of the Pacific coast business men at Japan's capital today was marked by the issuing of an imperial edict by the mikado calling on the Japanese people to cultivate friendly relations with America and the Western hemisphere and to cease the "war of words" that may result in the disruption of international relations.

MINORITY STOCKHOLDERS ARE SUING COMPANY

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Oct. 14.—Attorneys for three large oil corporations are engaged today in preparing a defense to the suit of several minority stockholders of the Utah Crown Oil company, who have asked the federal court to prevent the lease of Kern county oil lands to the Babcock Petroleum company of San Francisco.

OIL TANK EXPLODES; FLAMES RAGE UNCHECKED

BALTIMORE, Md., Oct. 14.—A huge oil tank adjoining the house of the Standard Oil plant at Canton in this county, exploded at 3 o'clock this afternoon. It is impossible to stop the flames and it is not known whether anyone was killed or injured. The cause of the explosion cannot be ascertained at present.

WESTERN FEDERATION BOYCOTTS NEWSPAPER

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 14.—A special dispatch received from Juneau, Alaska, says that the Western Federation of Miners is boycotting the Alaska Daily Record, a newspaper of the camp, because of the paper's opposition to the federation. According to the dispatch, the miners have circulated a petition asking every storekeeper to discontinue patronizing the paper in any way under gain of a boycott being instituted against the stores that refuse. The story says that only one store and two hotels has heeded the petition.

STEEL SAVES ROADS ARE IN GOOD CONDITION

KLAMATH FALLS, Or., Oct. 14.—W. G. Steel returned last evening from Crater Lake. He states that the weather is almost perfect at the lake and is as warm as it has been. The light and fall of last week disappeared and the roads are in the best of condition. The tourist travel is about over, although there are a few coming in each day.
