 of time wood pipe is guaranteed?
People of the City of Medford
 want water, and some of them want the city to own and operate the water system.
 If the gravity system wins, then the city will operate the water system and the city council will fix the water rates and it will hire people to run it.
 Now, the same thing will happen if the pumping proposition wins. The city will own and operate the water system and the city council will fix the water rates, and it will hire the Condor company to run the water system, and it will be under the control and supervision of the city council.
 Now, what is the difference whether the city council hires some people to run the water system or hires the Condor company (a corporation) to run it?
 The city of Medford for some years past has had different city council hire people to run the water system, and they have all run the city in debt and have not even paid operating expenses, much less interest or any portion of the water debt.
 The city of Medford had a similar experience with the electric light system, but it now hires the Condor Water & Power company (a corporation) to run it for them, and for this service it gives the Condor company 95 per cent of the gross revenue.
Electric Light System.
 What is the result of the operation of the electric light system by the Condor company?
 The city is now getting at the rate of \$1000 per year out of the light system, and most of its street lights free, whereas under city operation the city went deeper in debt every year.
 The question is, then, which is the better for the people?
 Do you want the city council to run the water system in the future, with a change of help and a change of policy every year?
 What can you expect of a city council, now matter how honorable or honest they are, when they have other business to attend to and do not understand the operation of a water system?
 Can you expect any city council to devote their time and energies in running a water system without pay for their services?
