supporting until the trees have attain ed a ten years' growth, and in the meantime the purchasers will have to wait, supporting themselves by some other means. Where the buyers are other means. where the buyers like practical farmers the land can be made to support the family in the raising of vegetables, small fruits or poultry, and good many of the buyers are prepar ing to go on their newly acquired tracts in time to plant a crop for next year.

"The awakening of the fruit indus try appears to be general all over west Splendid Oregon, and big farms are likely to be cut up for orchards in every coun ty where the apple has proved a pay-ing product."-Oregonian.
