### MEN AS THEY ARE.

The Portland Oregonian in discussing the strife between a power for good and one for evil says:

"Wherever we look we behold injustice and wrong. Perhaps there is less of them than in former times, but they still exist and very often they are victorious in human affairs. No matter how good the intention may be, no matter how lofty or holy the indwelling ideal may be, our schemes, our customs, our institutions, seem inveterately to produce a harvest of misery and wrong. So true is this dreadful rule that men have learned to sneer at such words as 'love,' 'brotherhood,' 'non-resistance,' 'optimism' and it has become a mark of sound prudence in conduct to shun every project which promises ideal good or even very much material good."

The indwelling ideal is the test of man and is the real man. The body, the mere animal part of man, the creature of the flesh and blood, of whims and prejudices—these are the mask which hide the reality. The spiritual being is often completely hidden, even from those intimates who know his acts well enough to guess at his thoughts and motives, for at best the estimate of the inner man must be a guess, because no man can be sure of another's motive. A shrewd and broad-minded man can make, however, a pretty fair estimate, if the acts and professed principles of a man through a long period be taken as the criterion. But so few are broad-minded and so few go to the heart of things and recognize the fact that good and evil in man—at once the glory and the scandal of the universe—are inextricably mixed. Judgments are based upon the judge's personal predilections and usually with a side glance at the critic's own failings. It is not "what a man has or even what he does which expresses the worth of man, but what he is," and this real man often remains undiscovered until some vital test is made.

"Good and ill," says Hume, "are universally intermingled and confounded—happiness and misery, wisdom and folly, virtue and vice." They certainly are in real men, who, as Alexander Hamilton remarks, are "reasoning but not reasonable animals." Many men who bear the aspect of evil are heroes in essentials, and many men whose deportment is entirely correct are at heart untrustworthy and base.

Some men of great respectability cannot stand great tests, while, on the other hand, many men who do not make a good appearance before the world are sound at heart and possess the essentials of nobility of soul—possess an indwelling ideal.

### WINTER IN THE ROGUE RIVER VALLEY.

Neither the fabled skies of Arendia, the anemyst hues of Italy or the amaranthine tints of California surpass the splendor of the heavens that arch the Rogue River valley in this most delightful season of the year. The noonday sun showers the multi-colored hills with gold; a delicate touch of winter has painted in brilliance the fast falling leaves, and yellow and crimson and the dark of the evergreen mingle in tangled profusion along river bed and hill slopes; the russet summer brown of the fields is changing as if by magic into a tender green; the stubble of grain fields is losing itself in long, straight black furrows. A tinge of frost wipes out the evil growths of a too luxuriant period, and dispels the unhealthy mists that her wanton profusion has engendered, so she may start anew and reclothe the world with a yet more brilliant verdure.

No season could be more delightful than this late autumn or early winter, in the Rogue River valley, where a touch of ice sends the blood tingling, casts out ill humors, and awakens human energy to higher endeavor; where radiant noons alone furnish a sufficient reason for existence, and where the splendor of the night with its new born slender crescent of silver-gold, hanging in the west, supplies inspiration for the present and hope for the future.

We are lucky people to live in such a region—and who would exchange our smiling land for bleak New England, the storm-swept Atlantic coast—the snowy blankets of the Mississippi valley, the blizzard-swept prairies, the never-ending rain of Puget sound and Portland, or even the enmi and monotony of cloudless southern California?
