ROOSEVELT FOR CHAMBERLAIN.

President Roosevelt greeted Governor Chamberlain at Washington Saturday with the following words:

"I am glad to meet you, Governor Chamberlain and senator-to-be. I would have preferred to see a republican elected senator, but I am for the people ruling and want yo uto be senator.'

Thus does the president rebuke the little scheming politicians of his party in Oregon for endeavoring to thwart the will of the people as expressed at the polls and thus does he put the power and prestige of the presidency at the service of the people in their effort to rule.

The president is fully cognizant of the situation in Oregon, of the frantic efforts being made by Senator Fulton and others to secure the election by breech of faih and violation of pledges of a republican as United States senator, in spite of the fact that the people had voted for a democrat.

President Roosevelt is a strong partisan-so strong that he frequently champions his enemies to secure vantage to his party, yet he is not partisan enough to sanction the campaign of dishonor now being made by machine leaders in Oregon to secure that which can only be secured by repudiation of pledges.

As Gulliver was to the Liliputians, so Roosevelt is to the politicians of his party, and his attitude has sounded the death knell of those little men who sought through broken faith to snach a toga from the chosen of the people.
