BOSTON, Mass., Dec. 18.—A sensation has been created in the religious and social circles of Monson by the discovery that a local minister, the Rev. George Andrews, is the author of a new novel of an exceedingly frank and lurid nature. Members of Dr. Andrews' congregation were shocked and grieved by the revelation, as the book is alleged to deal with phases of life with which a parson is not supposed to be familiar.

The story deals with the errors of a minister who was handicapped, without his knowledge, by a weight of hereditary failings.

In melodramatic fashion, a heroine is introduced into the story. She escapes from a villain and goes into a burlesque company on the stage, where she is subjected to insults that are treated in an unrestrained manner.

This girl falls in love with the minister here. They are married and live happily until the strain of lawlessness of his ancestors comes upon him, and drives him into paths all decent men would avoid.

The loving, persistent faith of the wife finally retrieves the minister, winning him back from unfortunate attachments. The scenes are depicted in a way astounding to laymen, and much more so when written by an ordained clergyman.

The Rev. George Andrews is a graduate of Colby college. Until ten years ago he was a teacher in small New England towns. Then he entered the ministry.

### THOUSANDS OF OYSTERS ARE GOING TO WASTE

BALTIMORE, Md., Dec. 18.—Since the oyster season opened thousands of bushels of fine Chesapeake Bay oysters have gone to waste, the dealers being unable to find a market which would net reasonable profits.

For the first time since the civil war probably a dozen eggs will buy a bushel of oysters and that bushel will open nearly a gallon. The cost of opening—20 cents—is almost the price of the oysters.

This is the best season for oysters in a good many years, but for the oyster packer and shipper it is the poorest in many seasons.

The oysters are large, fine and plentiful, but there is no market for them. The stringent times is largely responsible.

It is thought that the arrival of the holiday season will result in an increased demand for the bivalves, but in the meantime the concerns engaged in the oyster business have suffered heavy loss through their inability to market their product.
