#### LIFE PRISON'S XMAS GIFT A FULL PARDON

TOPEKA, Kan., Dec. 29,-Governor Hoch on December 22 pardoned John Collins, now serving a life sentence in the Kansas state penitentiary for the murder of his father, J. S. Collins, a well-to-do real estate and insurance man of this city, in May, 1898. Collins

Young Collins was a student at Kan sas university at the time of his father's death. He was convicted on the testi mony of three negroes, all of it being circumstantial in character.

At the trial the state set up the plea that Collins was in love with Miss Frances Babcock of Lawrence, Kan., and planned the killing of his father that he might obtain the life insurance which the senior Collins carried upon his life.

One of the negroes upon whose testi-mony Collins was convicted has since written a book asserting that the testimony of the three negroes at the trial was a part of a plan by enemies of young Collins to ruin him by fixing the responsibility for his father's death up-on him.
