

RUSSIAN NURSE READY FOR TRIAL NEXT WEEK

NEW YORK, Jan. 3.—Without fear and with her shattered health completely restored, Sarah Kuten, the young Russian nurse who slew Dr. Samuel Auspitz because it is alleged he wronged her, is prepared to face the ordeal of her trial, scheduled to begin before Justice Vernon M. Davis, in the criminal branch of the supreme court day after tomorrow.

Sarah is a "model" prisoner, and not once during the 24 hours is she absent from her little baby. In a small rosewood cradle, at the side of the white prison cot occupied by the mother, the little fellow sleeps at night. During the day the mother when not busy sewing on garments for him to wear when he appears in court, is walking about the hospital singing and talking and bringing cheer to the other prisoners.

Emotional insanity will be the plea of the young prisoner when arraigned in for trial, and her attorneys expect to lay before the jury evidence that they believe will bring forth the acquittal Sarah will take the stand in her own defense and tell the story of the alleged wrong inflicted by the man she slew.

"I have no fear of the outcome," said the young prisoner. "I don't believe there are 12 men in all the world who would convict me after hearing my story. My only worry is that I shall be separated from my baby during my trial, for he will be such a comfort to me during the long hours I must spend in court."

ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION IN ANNUAL SESSION

NEW YORK, Jan. 3.—The annual meeting of the Intercollegiate Athletic Association of the United States convened here today at the Murray Hill hotel. This is the association which grew out of the call issued by Chancellor MacCracken of New York university for a convention of colleges to move against football in 1905.

The work of the association is purely educational and persuasive. In keeping with such objects, the morning session of the association was taken up with the reading of papers on the academic side of college sports. There will be the proper control of student sports, summer baseball and the like. A feature will be a debate on this question, "Shall students in good collegiate standing who have previously played baseball for money be permitted to represent their institutes in intercollegiate baseball contests?"

In order to encourage attendance at the convention, the executive committee has agreed upon a change in the by-laws whereby two or more colleges or universities may unite to send a single delegate. The association has grown considerably since 1905, and has been instrumental in forming minor associations in the New England states, in Pennsylvania, West Virginia and the Missouri valley. It is the ambition of the I. C. A. U. S. some day to include in its membership every college and university in this country interested in any way in sports.

WILL SACRIFICE TWO MONKEYS TO SCIENCE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3.—Twenty monkeys caged on the top floor of the George Washington University Laboratory are to be experimented on to find out to what extent the monkey's brain may be developed by training and education, and how far and how rapidly it will retrograde after daily training ceases and the monkey is allowed to resume his natural habits.

A famous scientist who has delved deeply into the question of mental diseases and who is regarded as one of the foremost brain specialists in the world, will conduct the experiment with the simians, it is understood. Two monkeys will be trained together until they reach approximately the same point of development. One of the monkeys will be killed and his brain analyzed and placed in alcohol. As soon as the other monkey is believed to have forgotten much that he has been taught he too will be sacrificed on the altar of science, his brain being analyzed and compared with that of the first monkey.

WOULD HAVE RACING UNDER NEW RESTRICTION

HOT SPRINGS, Ark., Jan. 3.—A legislative act which would permit racing here under restrictions has been presented by the business men's committee, asking for a 60 or 90 day race meeting here this year, to be divided between the late fall and spring meetings. The racing is to be conducted three days of each week, to be under the government of three citizens of the county, who shall be appointed by the governor. They shall receive their pay from the county after \$100 revenue is placed upon the racing each day.

The bill will be presented to the legislature the second week in January as a Business Men's league bill, and will be backed by local business interests.
