WANT MODEL LIQUOR LAWS

The National Association Gathers in Louisville to Discuss Prohi Wave

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Jan. 22,-To se are the adoption of eastel liquor taws. as a check to the wave of probibility and local option that is now precepting over the country is the object of the National Model License league which munenced a three days' session in Lousville today:

Leaders in the movement incornat ed by the league say radical improvment in the methods of dispensing at coholic beverages must be made if the liquor business is to remain a tegalized institution in many states and express a desire to hear the views of those who have plans to bring about improve

The league is a national organization The league is a national organization of 800 distillers, browers, winemakers, wholesalers, retailers and collateral tradesmen and is conducting a national campaign in behalf of a model because

The objects and purposes of the Mod-ol License league are to take the figure question out of politics and to take the lawbreaker out of the biquor business. If there is to be any trained reformtion, it is declared, it must be along

Formulated by Gilmore.

The model license law was foundated by T. M. Gilmore of Louisville, president of the N. Leville Model License league. For years Ar. Gilmore studied the liquor business by personal obser-vation in this country and in Europe, and he selected the new clauses of the heat laws of the best governed districts in the world.

The model license law provides that all liquor licenses in effect at the time of the passage of the law shall remain in effect until suspended or canceled because of violation of the law.

The law provides also that upon con-viction for a first offense the license holder must furfeit the right to do busi-uess for a period of 70 days, and upon a second, conviction by must furfeit forever his right to hold a liquor l serose in the state in which the licer has been forfeited.

Holders of licenses would be protect at from undue competition by that draw of model license law which p vides that after the passage of mod license law no new licenses can be i sued until the population is in the pr holder assurance of a reasonable amount of trade and therefore a reasonable profit on his investment, but would prothat society from the cribs that it is charged result from a multiplicity of drinking plus
