**GO WITH ARTIE**

OLYMPIA, Wash., Jan. 25.—The liquor forces of the state have lost the first trick in fighting the proposed local option bill of the anti-Saloon league. The house committee has recommended the bill without amendments back to the house for passage, and it will likely come before the body at the session Monday afternoon. It took the committee but a few minutes to accept the bill as drawn, and leave the house to the majority secured the favorable action, instead of postponement as was desired by the liquor interests.

The bill provided for county option. Arguing that such county should be the judge of its own institutions, the temperance people had prepared a bill with the provision that any county could banish the saloon and keep it out.

The other bill, intended to temperize with the question, provided for precinct local option, and for the submission to the people at each biennial election the question of "wet" or "dry."

This, it is argued, would keep before the people constantly the saloon question, and the more radical bill was recommended for passage.

**MINER HURLED 200 FEET AND LIVES TO TELL TALE**

NEVADA CITY, Jan. 25.—Miner O'Donnell, after a thrilling ride down a steep grade in a runaway ore car

hillside, still lives today and is likely to recover, say the physicians.

O'Donnell was coming down the moon train in a car from the Gray Eagle mine. After a little the brakes refused to work and the car soon began to gain in momentum. Presently it was whirling along at a fearful rate.

O'Donnell as what to stay in until the end of the track was reached meant sure death and toward the end of the incline he jumped. He was carried by the movement 200 feet through the air and fell at last upon the rocks, breaking his jaw and receiving internal injuries, besides any number of cuts and bruises.

Help was sent to him as soon as possible and last night he was brought to this place for treatment.

**ABRUZZI WOULD RESIGN TO WED KATE ELKINS**

PARIS, Jan. 24.—A special dispatch from Turin to the Petit Parisien says that the Duke of the Abruzzi has decided to resign from the navy and to renounce all rank and honors in order to marry Miss Catherine Elkins, but that the king has refused to accept the duke's resignation.

A number of officers conversant with the situation, who asked the queen aboard the battleship Regina to intercede with the king, were placed under arrest by Admiral Miraballo, the minister of marine. Many high naval officers have decided to resign with the Duke of the Abruzzi in token of their sympathy.
