In reality 91,840 agres in all were excluded from the reserve but of this 80,000 were covered eithe y entries or railroad scrip prior to its reliasion in the Umpqua antional forest y President Roosevelt's blanket order

Little of the land thrown open Thursday is valuable for either agricultural or timber purposes. This accounts for the small number of cutries. All of the other claim filed on are of inferior character.


