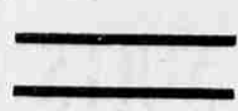

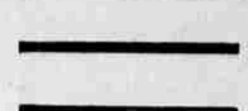

**FORMER RESIDENT OF JACKSON COUNTY CROSSES GREAT DIVIDE**

Abram Tene Brook died at Merrill, Cal., on Monday, January 4, at the age of 86, and was buried at Bonanza, this state. He was a former resident of the Rogue River valley, owned a farm at Jacksonville and was an Indian fighter.

He was born in Indiana in 1822. He crossed the plains to California in 1849, remaining there, working in the mines, about two years. He returned home, started west again, was shipwrecked, worked his way back to New York and in 1852 he again crossed the plains, this time for Oregon. When nearing the journey's end the whole party came near being massacred by the Indians.

The road led around a rocky point, where there was no chance of turning and here the Indians would lie in wait and kill them as they came.

By removing the logs and letting down the wagons with ropes before they came to the narrow road, they drove out on an open level, corralled their wagons and got ready for action.

When the Indians found they were defeated they wanted a "pow wow," or peace talk. The pioneers were finally permitted to pass.

During the Indian war in southern Oregon a fort was built on Mr. Ten Brook's farm near Jacksonville, and several families were stationed there until peace was restored.

In 1858 he again went east and in 1860 policed a train across the plains, making a third journey.

He was one of the pioneer settlers of the Goose Lake country, and had the first house with floor, the first garden in the first orchard.

He joined the Masonic order in Merrill, Cal. in 1848, and was a charter member of the Masonic lodge in Jacksonville. Many knew him for his charities and he was highly respected citizen. He is survived by Mrs. Brook and the following children: R. Ten Brook, Merrill, Ore.; John Ten Brook, Port Stevens; William Ten Brook, Coos Bay; and Mrs. Nellie Miller, Pine Valley.

**FIRE DESTROYS SKATING RINK IN CITY OF EUGENE**

EUGENE, Ore., Jan. 26.—Fire completely destroyed the Underwood skating rink on East Sixth street, between Willamette and Oak. It is not known how the fire started. The alarm was sounded at 11:35 and the whole wood-structure was in flames before the fire fighters arrived on the scene.

By heroic efforts on the part of the fire department and volunteers all the buildings in the neighborhood were saved. A barn less than 20 feet away from the burning building was saved and the Underwood skating house was flooded with water just in the nick of time. Its walls and roof were smoking before the water was turned on.

**LIGHT RUSH OF SETTLERS TO NEW LAND IN DOUGLAS**

ROSEBURG, Ore., Jan. 26.—The opening to entry of nearly 11,000 acres of land at the United States land office in Roseburg Thursday was not attended by a heavy rush of applicants. Thirteen entries were filed and these in the aggregate involve less than 1600 acres, or a little over one-seventh of the total acreage available. In reality 91,840 acres in all were excluded from the reserve, but of this 80,000 were covered either by entries or railroad scrip prior to its inclusion in the Unquon national forest by President Roosevelt's blanket order of March 2, 1907.

Little of the land thrown open Thursday is valuable for either agricultural or timber purposes. This accounts for the small number of entries. The banner claim, situated in Benton county, and containing 7,000,000 feet of timber, was covered by a homestead filing by Roscoe A. Wall, 748 Lovejoy street, Portland. The next best timber claim was also captured by a Portland man, Homer G. Holland, a telegraph operator, stationed in the Benton building. He filed a timber entry on a quarter section in Benton county containing 5,500,000 feet. A Coos county man, W. Wockley, homesteaded 80 acres of bottom land, which he will convert into a dairy ranch. All of the other claims filed are of inferior character.

**ROSEBURG COUPLE RUN AWAY AND ARE WED**

ROSEBURG, Ore., Jan. 26.—Two of Roseburg's popular young people, Mack Wickham and Miss Hazel Patterson, caused a great sensation in this city when it became known that they had eloped. They took the early morning passenger train for Redding, Cal., "Nick," as he is known around town, was the Crescent theater illustrated song artist, while Miss Patterson was his accompanist on the piano. She is the daughter of Contractor and Mrs. T. F. Patterson of this city and one of the most popular young ladies of the town. Wickham has been known to Roseburg people since last July, when he became popular as a soloist, having an excellent tenor voice.

Why they eloped is not explained, as she was of age and her parents say they would not have opposed the marriage.
