year. This notwithstanding the \$1927.75 expended by the Warren Construction company in developing the quarry as that rock can be economically quarried.

Pavement Main Street.

Street Names and House Numbers.

Four hundred and seventy-six sign-boards bearing the respective street names have been constructed under this

contract and placed at street intersections by this office.

Sectional plats of the city have been made and the house numbers arranged thereon. Slips bearing such numbers have been left at all dwellings in the original townsite and in all the east and west portion of the city. Practically all such dwellings have had the respective numbers placed thereon.

This work is now being carried on in the various other additions to the city and is nearing completion.

Sewers.

During the past year sewers have been constructed as follows:

6-inch sewer	3,650 lineal feet
8-inch sewer	11,286 lineal feet
10-inch sewer	3,812 lineal feet
12-inch sewer	1,265 lineal feet
14-inch sewer	1,690 lineal feet
16-inch sewer	7,265 lineal feet
Manholes	48
Isampoles	29

A total of 28,968 lineal feet, or 5.12 miles of sewers at a cost of \$37,693.95. Engineering on above, \$23.35, or at the rate of 2.2 per cent.

Water.

Under the supervision of Frank C. Kelsey, C. E., the city installed a cast iron water distribution system aggregating 37,477 lineal feet, or 7.1 miles, at a cost of \$45,186.60. Engineering on this work, \$1653.30, or at the rate of 3 per cent.

A source of municipal water supply was located at Little Butte creek and 23-mile gravity pipeline is now in course of construction under the supervision of W. J. Roberts, consulting engineer.

The approximate cost of this work is \$375,000.

Street and Road Machinery.

Street and road machinery has been purchased by the city as follows:

The city has received from the Warren Construction company as rental its roller for 24 1/2 days at \$3 per day, the sum of \$72.50, which is entered on this investment at the rate of 6.2 per cent for 1 year from the date of purchase.

Engineer's Office.

For the past year and a half the city's engineering has been quartered in the office of Osgood & Cummings.

The office expenses, including rent, fuel and light, have been paid by them. Office furniture, engineering instruments and equipment to the amount of \$927 are the property of that office, the city having been given the benefit thereof.

The city has furnished drafting papers, pencils, erasers, etc., used in the compiling of city records. Also drafting table and filing cabinets. All of such records, etc., are the property of the city.

Engineering Expenses.

The above items show public improvements supervised by this office to the amount of \$93,653.30, with an engineering charge against the same of \$1848.65, this being at the rate of 2 per cent for engineering on all contract work for the year.

Conclusions.

In summing up at this time, it will be seen that for a city of this size an unusually large amount of work has been accomplished in one year's time, and yet, when compared with what remains undone, it amounts to but little more than a good, fair beginning.

The water and sewer problems in the city are practically solved, there remaining but little more than the usual extensions to make as conditions require.

Many of our streets and the drainage, or rather the lack of such, would be a disgrace in the Philippines. These

conditions can be remedied only by persistent efforts made effective as funds are available for the work.

In any event, to obtain the desired results and to possess our city of the improvements to which she is justly entitled will require a long pull, strong pull and a pull all together on the part of city officials and citizens.

ORDINANCE NO. ...

An ordinance providing for the securing of rights of way for the gravity pipeline of the city of Medford, and authorizing the execution of the necessary agreements therefor.

Whereas, In securing the necessary rights of way for the gravity water pipeline for the city of Medford it is necessary in some instances to furnish an agreement for compensation for damages to crops and other similar damages, now therefore,

The city of Medford doth obtain as follows:

That the special gravity water committee heretofore appointed by the mayor and they are hereby empowered and directed to secure the necessary rights of way for the gravity water pipeline of the city of Medford, upon the most advantageous terms possible, and the mayor and recorder are hereby authorized and instructed in accoutre, on behalf of the city of Medford, such agreements as may be necessary to carry this ordinance into effect.

The foregoing ordinance was passed by the city council February 2, 1909; Effort voting aye, Merrick absent, Wortman aye, Emerick aye, Welch aye, Demmer aye.
